JAPANESE LANGUAGE INSTRUCTIONS

This course of instruction is designed to teach you some of the simpler basic questions and commands, plus a few filitary words and phrases useful in talking with prisoners, or luring Japs into a trap.

Japanese sounds do not always have their counterparts in English, but if they are pronounced in accordance with the rules to be given here, they will be

understood by any Japanese.

You won't be able to learn the words and remember the phrases unless you use them continuosly. We recommend that you share your lesson sheet with one of your tentmates. Pass on your knowledge to him, then use the words and phrases as much as possible.
